INVOCATION


In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.


THE COMMENDATION

Ruth Neidinger Obituary

Ruth Anna Neidinger passed away on December 7, 2023. Ruth was born on December 4, 1932, in Hackensack, New Jersey, to Harold and Ruth Geyer. She attended New Milford, New Jersey elementary schools and graduated from Hackensack High School. She worked for Atlas Insurance Co. in New York City as a stenographer. Later, she was employed by General Adjustment Bureau and was ultimately promoted to Clerical Consultant for the Eastern Department. In that capacity, she re-wrote the clerical manual which was used in all branch offices in the United States. As Clerical Consultant she set up storm offices in Puerto Rico and Nassau, Bahamas.

She met the "love of her life", Alfred (Al) Neidinger at her Father's retirement dinner and they were married a year later in 1966 and move to Hillsdale, New Jersey, where she worked for the Borough of Hillsdale and later for the Borough Attorney.
